STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES
Policy 404

# A. Policy Purpose

To establish a policy concerning the rights and responsibilities of students enrolled in Frederick County Public Schools (FCPS).

## **B. Definitions**

1. "Student" is defined to mean an individual who is enrolled in FCPS and for whom FCPS maintains the student's records or personally identifiable information. "Student" does not mean an individual who has not been in attendance at an FCPS school or program.

## C. Policy Statement

- 1. The Board of Education of Frederick County (Board) supports the systemic aspirational goals of equipping students to be empowered learners and engaged citizens.
- 2. The Board acknowledges the importance of informing FCPS students about their rights and responsibilities and expects that these rights and responsibilities are clearly communicated to students, parents/guardians, and FCPS staff members.
- 3. The Board is committed to providing an educational environment which promotes intellectual development, responsibility, citizenship and respect. The Board believes that all students have the right to free inquiry and expression, due process, equal educational opportunity, and freedom from discrimination.

## **D.** Implementation

- 1. The Superintendent shall ensure that student rights and responsibilities are communicated to students annually and are available to the school community, administrators, staff, and parents/guardians. Student rights and responsibilities are included in the <a href="Parent/Student Handbook">Parent/Student Handbook</a> and <a href="Student Code of Conduct">Student Code of Conduct</a>. This document shall be:
  - a. distributed within the first thirty (30) calendar days of the start of the school year; and,
  - b. made available in print and digital format.
- 2. Students retain all the rights and responsibilities articulated in all FCPS policies and regulations, as well as those defined by law.
